WATER SYSTEM IMPROVEMENTS WILL AFFECT YOUR NEIGHBORHOOD

The Village of Mexico water project will soon begin! This project will affect different areas of the village, and some areas more than others. You are receiving this notification as work is scheduled on your street. This project will include a new water storage tank, replacing some of the small diameter water mains, replacing fire hydrants, and main line valves. Many of these components are part of the original water system that was installed in 1913. These improvements are necessary to ensure the reliability, and quality of the drinking water, and improve the village's fire protection readiness.

WORK SCHEDULE

Work on this project will be completed in phases to minimize neighborhood disruptions.

Project Start: April 1, 2024

Project Completion: December 2024

Work Hours: 7:00 AM to 5:00 PM Monday through Friday, excluding holidays

WHAT TO EXPECT

Crews will create an open trench to install new water pipes. As work progresses, traffic patterns may shift, and parking restrictions may become necessary. At the end of each shift, trenches will be covered, and the work area cleaned. While work is underway, you should expect an increase in construction-related traffic and sounds. If access to your street or driveway is blocked, please alert crews and allow several minutes for the contractor to provide you safe access. When a street is "CLOSED" it will remain open to local traffic, and emergency vehicles. When the project is complete, any disturbed landscaping will be restored to preconstruction conditions.

TEMPORARY WATER OUTAGE

Temporary water outages lasting up to one day at a time are necessary to complete this project. If your property is subject to a planned water outage, you will receive a separate notice in advance of the outage.

WATER FLUSHING

During construction, you may notice water running down the street. To complete construction, W.D. Malone crews must flush water from a nearby hydrant. This flushing ensures the integrity of the new pipes as well as safe, clean water to your tap. During this process you will experience cloudy/discolored water. When this happens the please run outside hose bibs, flush toilets, etc., before running faucets, dishwashers, and washing machines that all have sediment screens that could clog.
